UNDERSTANDING CHURCH

Session Description:

This session presents the concept of Church as mystery and explores the various models of the Church and the four marks of the Church.

Focus of the Session:

The Church "is the Reign of Christ already present in mystery (*CCC* #763)." The Church is seen as a living, vibrant reality in the life of the community, rooted in Christ, which gathers and leads the people of God in community, worship and service.

Content:

In conducting this session the instructor will:

- 1. Invite the participants to explore the models of the Church.
- 2. Present the marks of the Church: one, holy, catholic, and apostolic.
- 3. Present an awareness of the Church as the mystical Body of Christ and people of God.
- 4. Incorporate a variety of teaching methods and present age-appropriate understandings of the various models of the Church.

Learning Outcomes:

As a result of the session the catechist will:

- 1. Develop an understanding of the Church as the mystical Body of Christ and people of God.
- 2. Understand the marks of the Church: one, holy, catholic, and apostolic.
- 3. Become familiar with the models of the Church, recognizing their strengths and limitations.
- 4. Be aware of age-appropriate methods of teaching the models and marks of the Church.
