THE SACRAMENTAL LIFE OF THE CHURCH

Session Description:

This session explores the seven sacraments and their place in the life of the people of God.

Focus of the Session:

"The seven sacraments touch all stages and all the important moments of Christian life: they give birth and increase healing and mission to the Christian's life of faith (CCC #1210)."

Content:

In conducting this session the instructor will:

- 1. Introduce the theology of sacraments and the life of grace.
- 2. Discuss the stages of life as marked by the sacrament: initiation, healing, and vocation.
- 3. Explore the rituals and symbols of the sacraments.
- 4. Explain the Biblical understanding of sacraments as "instituted by Christ."

Learning Outcomes:

As a result of this session, the catechist will:

- 1. Understand how the sacraments celebrate the lived experience of the Church.
- 2. Realize the sacraments are particular moments of an ongoing process of conversion.
- 3. Be convinced of the personal and communal nature of the sacraments.
- 4. Develop an understanding of grace associated with sacraments.
- 5. Understand the importance of the Eucharist as "Sacrament of sacraments" (CCC #1211).
